

Fair Housing

The County of Fresno partners with the Fair Housing Council of Central California (FHCCC) for delivery of services related to affirmatively furthering fair housing for Fresno County residents. The FHCCC has been the County's fair housing service provider since May 2000.

The FHCCC was founded in 1994 as a private nonprofit fair housing agency dedicated to the creation of racially and economically integrated communities, neighborhood diversity, and the elimination of discriminatory housing practices. The FHCCC provides a comprehensive program of fair housing outreach and education, investigation and enforcement of claims pertaining to fair housing infractions, advocacy, and counseling. As an enforcement agent empowered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under the Fair Housing Act, the FHCCC investigates and processes claims of housing discrimination for remedy and relief under the law.

The FHCCC organizes fair housing education workshops to housing industry representatives from banking and lending, insurance, landlord/property management, and real estate brokerage firms. The FHCCC also conducts individual training programs with property managers in the County as well as fair housing education and outreach events for agencies that provide social services or other advocacy services to clients identified as protected class members under fair housing law. Additionally, in cooperation with Fresno County and various other organizations, the FHCCC hosts an Annual Fair Housing Conference during the National Fair Housing Month in April of each year. The County serves as a sponsor and a participant.
